NOTE OF CLOSED MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 4 JULY 2019

- 1. Gary outlines the options for housing in the NP in the light of the approval of the Grace Homes planning consent for 23 houses:
 - a. Do not make an allocation, rely on windfall, evidence that would be reasonable to achieve within 12 years, more palatable for community, would pass examination BUT would increase vulnerability: if an application came in, would lose control; if HDC fell below their 5 year housing supply (currently got 7 years)
 - Allocate a site. Site assessments need to be looked at afresh given reduced numbers of houses required. Require a minimum of 5. If add 10% buffer = 8. If 20% buffer = 11. Would Cow Close accept 8?
 - c. Could allocate Grace Homes, with balance met by windfall. Not popular given evidence against Grace Homes site.
- 2. Gary recommends that we do have an allocation, preferably 8-10 houses to provide a buffer. People have said they want sites if 10-11 houses. Mixed views about whether this should be Cow Close, would mean it would move future development towards that side of the village.
- 3. Members identified quite a few small sites which are likely to be put forward for planning.
- 4. Concern expressed about Walnut Paddock and future plans to build on part of it. Agreed now appropriate to become a Local Green Space.
- 5. The Lines to Development need to be redrawn around all existing housing and that to be built by Grace Homes.
- 6. All agreed that we need to proceed as soon as possible with the NP to protect the village, and do it right.
- 7. Actions agreed:
 - a. HTG to meet and review site assessments on numbers, remove North End, and 30 at Cow Close
 - b. Need to revise LTD, including around Grace Homes and reducing Cow Close
 - c. Need to add in another criteria: is it deliverable? Eg Local Green Space, flood risk, heritage assets, countryside location.
 - d. Environment TG to look at update done by John Martin and consider any other changes needed to their work eg Walnut Paddock
 - e. Gary to draft report for HPC on 17 July asking them to determine number of allocation required (5, 8, or 11), setting out timeline and costs
 - f. Gary to update NP after HPC meeting in July for August meeting
 - g. Chris to consult Parish Councillors about August HPC meeting, possibly 12 or 19 August for decision re moving to Regulation 14
 - h. NPAC to meet when work done by Theme groups to take overview and decide on recommendations to HPC

8. Other points made

- a. Feeling that AC not been fully engaged until now eg did not see site assessments
- b. Agreed to remain at windfall of 5
- c. AC to recommend an location is made
