The highest ranking green space within the village from the initial consultation event, this area is well used with full public access. The allotments provide residents with access to a garden of their own for growing produce and the community of growers is thriving. There is good diversity of planting which provides excellent insect habitat. This in turn supports gatherings of swallows and house martins as well as other varied bird and animal life. South of the growing area is set aside as grassland with picnic benches and tables. The setting in the heart of the village, with beautiful views to the south, is idyllic and the public footpath across links the popular walking route up the Goadby Road with the historic Buttercross and Bewicke public house. To the east is a tranquil children's play area with a rocking horse, adjacent to a row of early Victorian almshouses and enclosed by a brick wall contemporary with the cottages. 160	786 962	<b>Hare Pie Bank/Stowe Close/Tentus.</b>	This iconic landscape, visible from many parts of the Village, achieved equal highest scoring to feature as one of our Protected Green Spaces. It defines Hallaton as its ceremonial site, and its history and beauty are highly valued by Villagers. The steeply rising ridge and furrow, and parkland with ancient trees of Hare Pie Bank has been the setting for the Easter ceremony of Bottle Kicking since time immemorial. Legends of ancient sites of worship and pilgrimage, long associated with this landscape, have been made material by recent excavations revealing the remains of medieval St Morrell's Chapel, itself built over Roman remains, and what is probably an Iron Age trackway. The most interesting approach to the site along the narrow pathway of Tentus between old stone walls, leading to a bridge crossing the stream is a favourite village walk. Although this deeply sunken old lane at first sight would not seem to qualify as a green space, over the centuries it has taken on a unique aspect which has become a much valued feature for Hallaton people and visitors. Its high banks and interlacing trees form a beautiful green corridor with lovely views down to the old cruck cottage. It is a favourite, tranquil route for walkers, cyclists and horse riders. It is a historic way, leading from the Church onto the ancient Goadby Road, and connecting with the public footpath to the old Mill mound. Its steep borders which abut the old pasture of Pump Close on one side, and the allotments on the other, offer excellent habitat for small mammals, birds and invertebrates.
