# Leicestershire County Council Fair Processing Notice

This notice is to tell you about why we need your information and how we will handle it. This notice is for Leicestershire County Council's Communities Team for the purposes of collecting Make Your Mark information on the Leicestershire Communities Website, to understand who is involved, how they are involved and actions they take for Make Your Mark 2024

## What Information do we need from you?

We need to know the following about you: Name; Where will you vote for Make Your Mark 2024; School/college/youth provision name (optional); How did you get involved with Make Your Mark 2024; How do you feel about 11-18 year old's being able to vote about issues affecting them (optional); Tell us anything you would like to share about young people having a voice on the Communities website (optional)

#### Why do we need this?

We ask for this information so we can monitor engagement with Make Your Mark 2024. This includes collecting information on registration, voting, potentially identifying schools/colleges/youth groups and their members who have taken part and issues identified by young people

We will only share anonymised data on the Communities website, unless we have specifically agreed this with

## Why are we allowed to process your information?

Data protection law allows us to process your information within certain conditions. In this case we are using performance of a contract as the lawful condition for us to do this.

We also need an appropriate lawful reason to process sensitive data. In this case we are processing your sensitive personal data because you have given your consent

#### Who will we share this with?

Sometimes we need to share your information with others. We will only do this when it is necessary if we are required to do so by law. We do not plan to share it with anyone else or use it for anything else. When it is necessary, we may disclose your personal information to the following organisations: our employees, officers, web provider.

### How will we keep it secure?

We will take all reasonable steps to prevent the loss, misuse, or alteration of your personal information. Only the people who need to see your personal information will be allowed access to it. We will not send your information outside of the UK. We may lift your data from the website, if we need to do this, we will store your data on a secure database for a maximum of two years

#### How long will we keep it for?

We will only keep this information for as long as necessary or as the law requires. For this service that would normally be two years, until the next Make Your Mark voting

#### What if something changes?

If the information you provided changes, or your circumstances change contact the Communities Team

## What are your rights?

You may request to see a copy of the personal information we hold about you. The law also provides you with other rights regarding your information including: correction of inaccurate data, objection to processing, moving your information to somewhere else, and in some cases, getting your information deleted.
